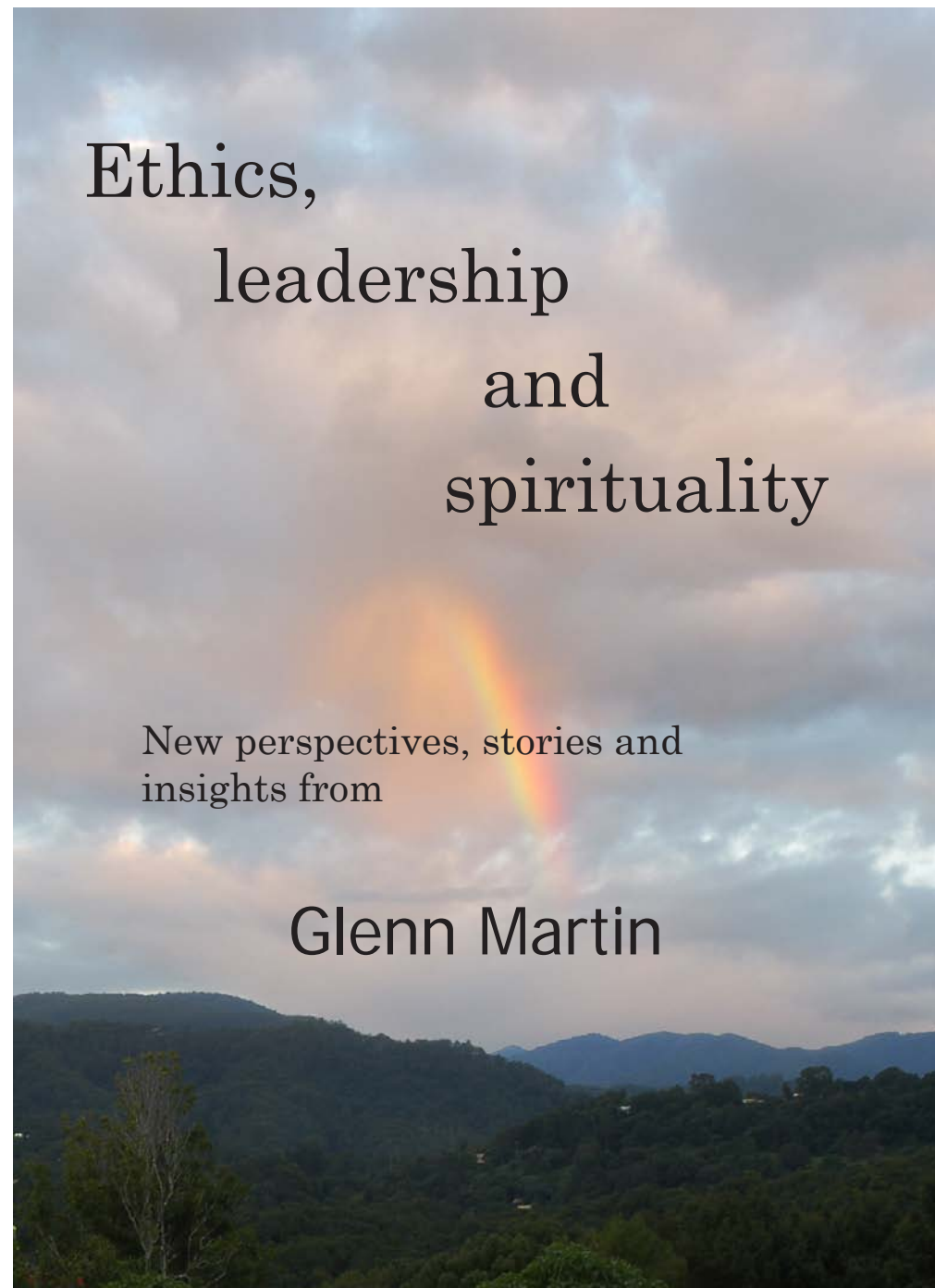

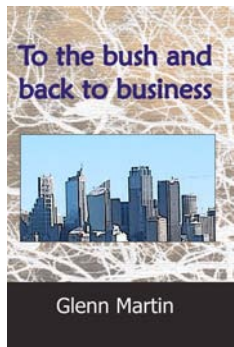

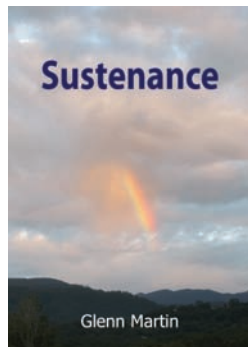
### To the bush and back to business

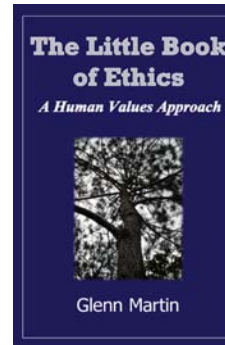
### Sustenance

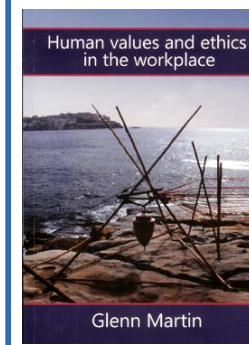
### The little book of ethics: a human values approach

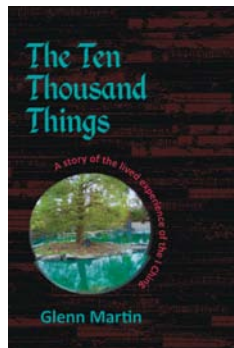
